The IBB

The Institute for Educational Management and Economics (IBB) at the University of Teacher Education Zug was founded in 2003 by Prof. Dr. Xaver Bueler and further developed and expanded from 2006 by Prof. Dr. Stephan Huber.

It has a research and development mandate, but also sees itself as a service facility for teachers, school management, school supervision and school administration, school boards, the federal states and the federal government. Cantons, ministries and institutions concerned with the quality and development of educational institutions. The target groups are individual actors and institutions in the education sector, in particular managers.

The institute is thematically focused on the following areas:

1. Quality and development in education

(Quality & innovation management, current trends and challenges)

2. Personnel management in the education sector

(esp. professionalization: teacher training, further education and training, management development)

(Biography, Education, Perspectives)

The results of the research and development activities flow back into the professional field in the sense of knowledge transfer. In the spirit of "Responsible Science", the aim is to make a contribution to supporting school policy, school administration and school practice. "Leading Quality" (LeadQ) project cluster

In the Leading Quality (LeadQ) project cluster - "Developing quality(s) - shaping schools: School leadership, school development and school quality" - the Institute is conducting longitudinal research in a mixed-methods control group design on various interventions in the support and qualification of school leaders, including school leadership coaching, support for school development/ school development advice and innovative training programs in the federal states of Berlin, North Rhine-Westphalia and Schleswig-Holstein.

The following programs are and have been scientifically monitored:

- The "School Turnaround: Berlin schools take off" project is being carried out jointly by the Robert Bosch Stiftung and the Senate Department for Education, Youth and Science in partnership with the participating Berlin districts. The school turnaround at the 10 participating Berlin schools is to be achieved through comprehensive and tailor-made school development processes.
- "impakt schulleitung", the school leadership program of the Wübben Foundation, supports head teachers of schools in a weak social environment in North Rhine-Westphalia in the further development of their school. In order to initiate a tailor-made process at the respective school, "impakt schulleitung" offers a comprehensive range of support services.
- "PerspektivSchulen" is a program to support pupils and multi-professional teams at schools in challenging situations in Schleswig-Holstein. Schools in disadvantaged social environments receive additional support as part of the program so that they can develop better prospects for themselves and their pupils.

Projects in Switzerland and Austria are currently being added. The research project in Austria was put out to tender by the Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Research (BMBWF) in a competitive process and will be included in the National Education Report Austria 2024.

In addition, longitudinal analyses are carried out on impact aspects and thus on changes in school quality, including special areas such as emotional and social development, connectedness, cooperation and innovation capacity in relation to different outcome variables.

Among other things, it has developed a theoretical framework model for theory-based empirical research, collected extensive data in Germany, Austria and Switzerland, produced scientific expert reports and provided consultancy services on the role of school leadership and school leadership development for the Conference of Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs, the Ministry of National Education, Children and Youth in Belgium, the Bertelsmann Foundation, the State of Hesse, as well as the Federal Ministry of Education and Research in Germany has developed numerous concepts for qualification programs at various universities, state institutes, foundations and publishing houses.

KPSM is a self-assessment specially tailored to the pedagogical leadership context, which enables teachers interested in leadership activities as well as newly appointed and experienced school leaders to assess their personal situation in order to address the new or already experienced professional requirements. The self-assessment provides impetus for reflection in order to recognize possible potential and areas in which one can and wants to develop personally. With PROFLEC (Professional Learning through Feedback and Reflection), KPSM has also been expanded internationally.







Qualification, support and advisory services

The Institute's range of activities includes qualification and support services (including advisory services) in training and further education for school stakeholders (student teachers, teachers, pedagogical leaders), stakeholder groups (steering groups, school management teams) and the entire college (internal teacher training and further training) and offers for school boards, school supervisory authorities, school administration and education policy as well as for university lecturers. The Institute offers support through various forms of coaching such as collegial team coaching, process coaching, peer coaching, resource-oriented coaching and at the same time conducts comprehensive longitudinal research into different forms of coaching, cf. projects such as e.g. impakt schulleitung, PerspektivSchulen, School Turnaround - Berliner Schulen starten durch.

The World Education Leadership Symposium (WELS) has been the largest international symposium on education and leadership issues in Europe for over 15 years. The international symposium has been held in Zug since 2009, most recently with over 800 education experts from around 70 countries from practice and science. The conference languages are German and English. Since 2020, the symposia have also been held as online conferences. Since 2021, they have been offered online either in the WELSfocus and WELSmain format - with a focus on a current topic that is the focus of the condensed one-day event, or as an online conference lasting several days with plenary and parallel program sections.

The aim of the symposium is to exchange ideas, knowledge and experiences on developing the quality of education and schools, thereby making an important contribution to a sustainable society. It shows ways in which the quality of educational work can be further developed.




